The Battle of Lone Jack.

KANSAS CITY, Aug. 20.--The federal loss in the engagement at Lone Jack on Friday last, is understood to have been one hundred and fifty killed and missing. The balance of the force escaped to Lexington. The section of artillery was lost and retaken four times, and finally spiked and abandoned by the Federals. In the fight at Independence on the 11th Gen. Hughes, who commanded a Rebel regiment at Carthage and a brigade at Wilson's Creek was killed, and the notorious and brutal Col. Boyd and Col. Thompson were wounded, the former fatally
