On this 20th day of February A. D. 1864 personally appeared before me, the Clerk of the County Court within and for said County, Mrs. Mary Sherrin a resident of the County of Morgan and State of Illinois and her Post Office is Alexander Station aged 38 years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress, approved July 14, 1862: That she is the widow of John Sherrin who was a private in Company 10 commanded by Captain Eliaz Hecard in the Seventh regiment of Mo. State Militia commanded by Col. John S. Phelps in the war of 1861, who died at Gene Jack in the State of Missouri on the 16th day of August A. D. 1864, in consequence of a gun shot wound received at the battle of Gene Jack and was killed in the battle contracted in the service of the United States. She further declares that she was married to the said John Sherrin on the 6th day of April in the year 1857 at the County of Morgan and State of Illinois that her husband, the aforesaid John Sherrin died on the day above mentioned, and that she has remained a widow ever since that period, and has children of the following names and ages by said deceased, to wit: Conan the 1st day of Sept 1856 Conan 11 years now has any

as will more fully appear by reference to the proof hereto annexed. She also declares that she has not in any manner been engaged in, or aided or abetted, the rebellion in the United States, and I, Mary Sherrin do hereby constitute and empower WILLIAM S. FIELD, Esq. of St. Louis, Missouri, my true and lawful Attorney, in fact, for me, and in my name, place and stead to prosecute my said claim for Pension, and to receive the certificate therefor, and to that end to do all and singular such acts and things as may be necessary.
