I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 5324, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that Alfred M. Bartzell was enrolled at Warren, Va. Sept. 20th 61 in Co. "C", 4th Regiment of Me. Cav. (Volunteers, 3 years) and mustered into service as a Private. He is not on file in Co. "C", 7th Regiment of Me. Cav. Volunteers, not on file. On the Muster Roll of Co. "C" of that Regiment for the months of July & August, 1862, he is reported as a 2^d Lt. of Killed at the Battle of Lew Sept. 16th 1862.

by law to administer oaths for general purposes, Sarah J.
Baltzell who is a resident of St. Francisville
in the County of Clark in the State of Missouri aged 42
years, who, being by me, first duly sworn, according to law, doth on her oath make the
following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision of the Act of Congress,
passed July 4th, 1861, and the several Acts amendatory and supplementing the same regu-
lating Pensions to Widows and Minor Heirs of deceased Officers and Soldiers. That she
is the widow of Alfred M. Baltzell who was a Second Lieutenant
in Company "C" commanded by Captain A. P. Spillman
of the Seventh Regiment of Missouri Cavalry Volunteers

That said Alfred M. Baltzell entered the military service of the
United States as aforesaid, on the _____ day of _____ A. D. 1861
then residing at St. Francisville and that he continued in
said service until his death, which occurred on the 16 day of August A. D.
1862, at Stone Jack, Missouri, and the cause of his death was
wounds received in a Battle at said
Stone Jack and were

received in the military service of the United States, and in the line of his duty.
The further declares that she was married to the said Alfred M. Baltzell
on the 30th day of March A. D. 1862 at Lordburgery
in Spencer County in the State of Ohio

That she has by said marriage two children who were under sixteen years of age
at the time of the decease of her said husband, that is to say Isabel Baltzell
and Mary A. Baltzell
who reside at St. Francisville Clark County Missouri

That this applicant resides at St. Francisville Clark Co. Missouri and that she has re-
mained a widow since the decease of her said husband, as will more fully appear by reference
to the proof hereto annexed. And this applicant further swears that she has borne and
