Franklin contracted Chronic Diarrhoea in service & in line of duty continuing until Soldier's death and attendant physician testified, "I was called to attend said Franklin Oct 29, 1864, disease Chronic Army Diarrhoea, of which he died Jan 1, 1865. On this eighth day of March, A. D. 1864
personally appeared before me, a (next to a judge or clerk of a court) Clerk of the circuit court
in and for the County and State above named, Ann Jane Franklin whose POST OFFICE
ADDRESS is Olley Grove of the county of Van Buren in the State of
Missouri she being of the age of 32 years, who being first duly sworn according
to law, doth, on her oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provisions made by the
act of Congress, approved July 14th, 1862; that she is the widow of Thomas F. Franklin
who was a Private in Company A, commanded by Alfred B. Brown
7th Missouri in the 1st Regiment of Missouri Cavalry in the
war of 1861, who died at Olley Grove in the State of Missouri on
the 27th day of July, 1862 of Chronic Diarrhea
She further declares that she was married to the said Thomas F. Franklin in the
County of Scottland and State of Missouri on the first day
of November in the year 1860 that her husband, the aforesaid Thomas F. Franklin
was a Private in the 7th Missouri Cavalry on the day above mentioned, and that she has remained a
widow ever since that period.
For evidence of her marriage, she refers to the proof herewith submitted. She also declares that she has not engaged
in or aided or abetted the rebellion in the United States. And she further states that she believes there is no
public record of her said marriage, and no private record of said marriage, (as proof of marriage you will get a cer-
tified copy of the Public Record from the county you were married in, if possible; if not, write in when and where, and by whom you were married, and we will then advise
you what to do.)

She further declares that herself and her husband deceased had no children that were under the age of
sixteen years at the time of his death: their names, ages and residence, at the time of her husband's decease were as
follows:

She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the Pension to which she is entitled by reason of the services
and death of her said husband. And she hereby constitutes and appoints WM. E. PRESTON, Esq., LICENSED ARMY
AND NAVY WAR CLAIM AGENT, OF CLEVELAND, OHIO, her Attorney, with power of substitution, to prosecute this claim
and procure a certificate.

Also, personally appeared before me George Craig and Oscar P. Thornton
residents of Van Buren County, Missouri persons whom I certify
to be respectable and entitled to credit, and who being by me duly sworn, say that they were present and saw
Ann Jane Franklin sign her name to the fore-
going declaration; and they further swear that they have every reason to believe, from her appearance, their knowledge
of and acquaintance with her, that she is the identical person who represents herself to be, and they have no interest
in the prosecution of this claim; and they further say they know her husband to be dead, and that he died at
the time and place above stated, and that she is still a widow. That we have knowledge of her children above-stated, and
have reason to believe that her statements as to their ages and all other matters touching them are true. That their
knowledge of the identity of her husband with the soldier is derived from a personal acquaintance with him as a citizen
and soldier.

A, 7th Regiment of Ill Cavalry Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Sgt on the 26th day of Feb 1864, at Little Rock Ark, in Co. A, 4th Regiment of Ill Cavalry Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. A of that Regiment, for the month of dated Oct 11th 1864, he is reported Mustered out of service Oct 11/64 by reason of expiration of term. No evidence of death on file

I Hereby Certify, that I attended professionally, the late Thomas P
Manhattan in his last illness. I found him laboring under a disease, named
Chronic Army Dysentery^{Note 1.}

which prostrated him, and rendered him wholly unfit for military duty.

I was called about the twentieth day of October, 1864, and attended
him professionally until the 1st day of January 1865, when he died
at Niles in the State of Iowa . His death was caused by
said above described disease, which I am fully satisfied was contracted by him while in
the line of his duty, in the service of the United States.

The reasons for this opinion are ^{Note 2.} 1st That he was a sound
man before entering the Army 2^o
The malady of which he died is spec-
ific to the service, and not of his local
ity

From the time he returned from the army to the day of his death he was unable to
join his regiment, in consequence of said disability.

OFFICER'S CERTIFICATE TO DISABILITY OF SOLDIER.

Place, Troy Davis Co Iowa
Date, March 7th 1866



I CERTIFY ON HONOR, That I am late Captain of Company A of the 4th Cav Regiment of Missouri Volunteers, and am acquainted with Thomas P. Franklin who was a member of A Company. When he entered the service of the United States he was [Here state your personal knowledge, and belief as to the soldier's health.]

(Thomas P. Franklin entered the service Aug 61 and was posted by the regt to Missouri and found in a very particular and unusual position in the bottom of one tank when he was wounded in the chest. It is owned since I was sent of Co. A 4th Cav Mo. Vols. to which Co. Private Franklin belonged

To my knowledge he was disabled while in the service of the United States and in the line of his duty, at or on 24th of December or about the 31st day of March 1866, by [Here state nature of the wound or disease which produced the disability; also, how you know the facts to be true to which you certify.]

Williamson was appointed to Company A, 4th Cav, Mo. Vols. in the line of duty. Thomas P. Franklin was then with the discharges which soon became violent, preventing a chronic form of discharging him from performing the duties of a Soldier. The disease continued until Jan 27th 1865 when he died. I was personally present to the former fact, the latter his death was communicated to me by a member of his company.

I have no other in this County of Davis Iowa. Before the undersigned a Notary Public R. D. Anderson who was duly sworn that the foregoing facts in the foregoing are true. My commission expires on the 1st of May 1866.

SIR:

Transcript of proceedings had in the Probate Court of Scotland County, Mo., Aug. 7, 1908, showing the appointment of Deddrige S. Morris as guardian for Ann Jane Franklin, pensioned by widow's certificate No. 75,710, is herewith respectfully enclosed.

Under date of Sept. 1, 1908, you furnished the Bureau official notice of this appointment, hence the papers are not available for any purpose of this Bureau and are returned in order that they may be forwarded to the guardian.

There is also enclosed pension check for \$22, drawn August -- 1908. This check should probably be dated by you and then returned to Mr. Deddrige S. Morris, the guardian, with the information that the check having been drawn and mailed to the pensioner in payment of the pension in contemplation of the pension law and such check belongs to the estate of the pensioner. If he will indorse the same in his capacity as guardian, and have the bank also indorse it, it will be paid by the Assistant Treasurer of the United States, without further requirement.

All checks of this character can be sent to the Auditor, accompanied by a certified copy of letters of guardianship, and a new check will be given by the Auditor, made payable to the guardian. It is not believed, however, that in this case it will be necessary to take that action.

It is proper to add that the suggestion to have you correspond with the guardian in this case arises from the fact that the check is returned to you

to be properly dated, and hence the whole matter is left with you instead
of the corresponding being done in the Bureau.
