Miller in the 7th Regiment Cavalry, Missouri Volunteers, in the war of 1861, and who died on or about the 5th day of September 1862, in hospital at Jefferson City in the State of Missouri - said death being the result of wounds received in a guerrilla fight at "Lone Jack" in the State of Missouri, on or about the 16th day of August, A.D. 1862 - She further declares that her said son, upon whom she was wholly dependent for support, having left no widow or minor child under sixteen years of age surviving, declarant makes this application for a Pension under the abovesaid act, and refers to the evidence filed herewith, and that in the proper department, to establish her claim - She also declares that she has not in any way, been engaged in, or aided or abetted, the Rebellion in the United States; that she is not in the receipt of a Pension, under the 2nd Section of the act abovesaid, or under any other act, nor has she again married since the death of her son the said Charles H. Greattray

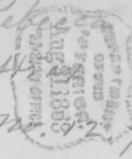

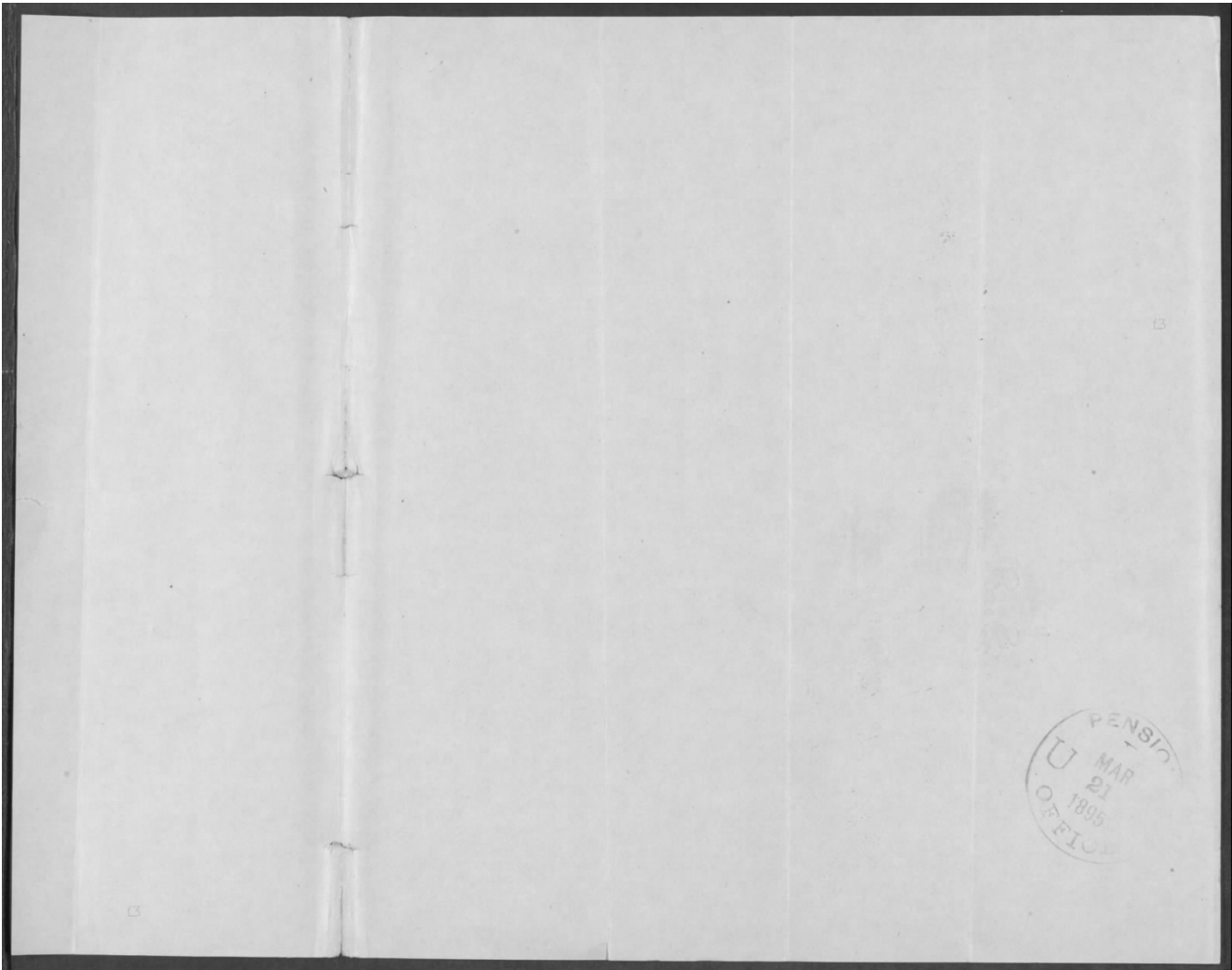

He was taken prisoner while in the S^o West and having gained a notoriety as a Union man he gave the name of Grant to his captors -

He finally escaped, but enlisted into the Federal army under his assumed name; (Grant) why he enlisted into our army under this name we cannot imagine but he did so - and a letter on file in the 2nd Auditor's office, will show that he requested his mother to address him by that name (Grant) - It was a foolish operation we confess - but the facts are as stated - let us hope no trouble will come to the mother through the folly of her son - Yours &c

should enlist in said Company
to which he did under the name he had
assumed and that said party who effected
the escape of said Charles gave in his
name to the recruiting officers of said
Company as Charles H. Grant the only
name he knew him by and said Charles
H. did not correct the name but
let it be as reported by his said friend.
This deponent cannot now tell the
name of the man who managed
the escape of said Charles from said
arrest by the secessionists.
That this deponent well & personally
knows the facts detailed that said
Charles' real name was Charles H.

Greatray and that he was the
son of Mrs Rebecca H Greatray of
Lee in the State of Massachusetts

Missouri with said Charles at the
time of his said arrest & escape and

In Madam I have before me a letter written by you to Capt Miller Co F 7th Cav. Mo. Col. he handed it to me he said he had not answered it although it was written the 35th of September 1862 it may not be to late get to answer some of your questions concerning your Son, as I was 1st Lieut of the company I had command of it in the fight at Lone Jack where your Son was mortally wounded (Capt Miller was not in the fight)

Charles H. Grant was a private in Co F 7th Cavalry Mo. Genl. Vol. 100 he was shot in the hip while doing his duty as a good and brave Soldier, he was taken to the Hospital as soon as practicable I saw him every day until our Regiment was ordered away from Lexington he then with about 100 others was put on a Steam Boat and taken to the General Hospital at Jefferson City Mo. where he afterwards died from the effect of the gun shot received at Lone Jack, he was when I saw him last very cheerful but said he would not get well but says he Lieut. I have done my duty as a Soldier and I would rather die from these wounds than to live to be an old man and die the death of a coward.

he was always ready for duty when called on he was a brave and fine looking man Alvin Grant a young man that was with him is discharged from the Service, I don't know where he is but I think his Father lives some where in Missouri, they said they were cousins, Charles told me confidentially that their name was non Grant but I do not remember now what they said it was they had got into some trouble in Missouri where I enlisted them in the Service, though I shall never think there was any thing wrong with them, I understood that Alvin Grant took charge of the effect

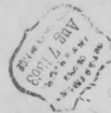
of Charles ^{he} left him at Sedalia Mo. when he remained until
he got his discharge on a certificate from the Surgeon that he was
not fit for the service. They were both men of good standing in our
Company as any men were, and they were well liked by all who was
acquainted with them. I do not know any thing about Alvin Grant
but before he is at home with his father the name I have forgotten
also the place or address of his father. I was told that Charles died
without pain, his hip inflamed and he of course after Amputation
took place did not suffer if there is any thing that I can do for
you in regard to drawing his back pay and bounty I will do it
with the utmost pleasure

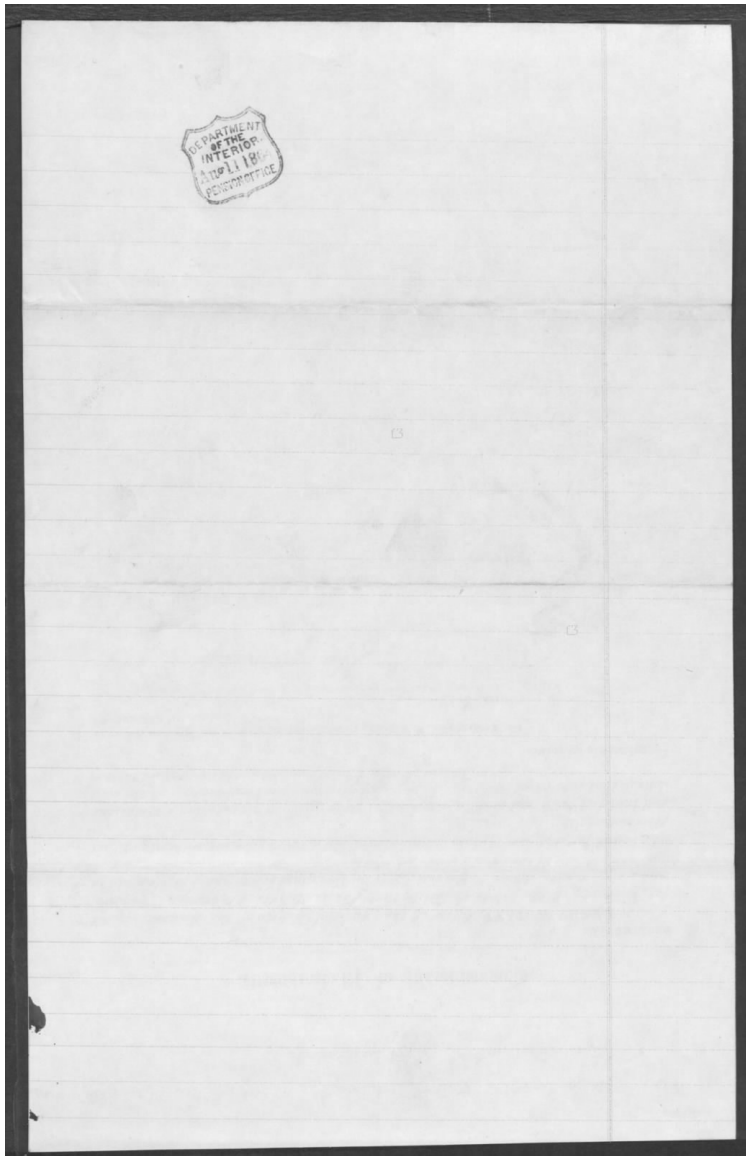
