Oliver Stearns in the 7th regiment of Voluntary Militia in the war of 1861, who was killed in the Battle of Lone Jack in Jackson County Missouri on the 16th day of August A. D. 1862.

The further declares that she was married to the said Giles Harvey on the twentyfourth day of July in the year 1861; that her husband, the aforesaid Giles Harvey died on the day above mentioned, and that she has remained a widow ever since that period,

as will more fully appear by reference to the proof hereto annexed. She also declares that she has not in any manner been engaged in, or aided or abetted, the rebellion in the United States.

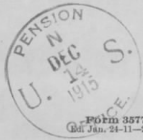
