Layport a resident of Kanawha County in the State of Illinois aged 23 years, who, being first by me duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress, approved July 4th, 1862; that she is the Widow of William Layport who was a Private in Company "C," commanded by Captain Phillips in the 1st Regiment of Missouri Cavalry Volunteers, commanded by Colonel Reid in the War of 1861, who ~~was~~ was killed at the battle of Lone Jack Mo. on the 16th day of August 1862, + while in the service aforesaid and the line of his duty.

She further declares that she was married to the said William Layport on the 9th day of May in the year 1858. that her husband, the aforesaid Wm Layport died on the day above mentioned and that she has remained a Widow ever since that period.

as will more fully appear by reference to the proof hereunto annexed. She also declares that she has not, in any manner, been engaged in, or aided or abetted the Rebellion in the United States.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that there is no evidence that William Laperot was enrolled on the 14th day of July, 1862, at Washington in Co. "C", 1st Regiment of McCary (Volunteers), to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 14th day of July, 1862, in Co. 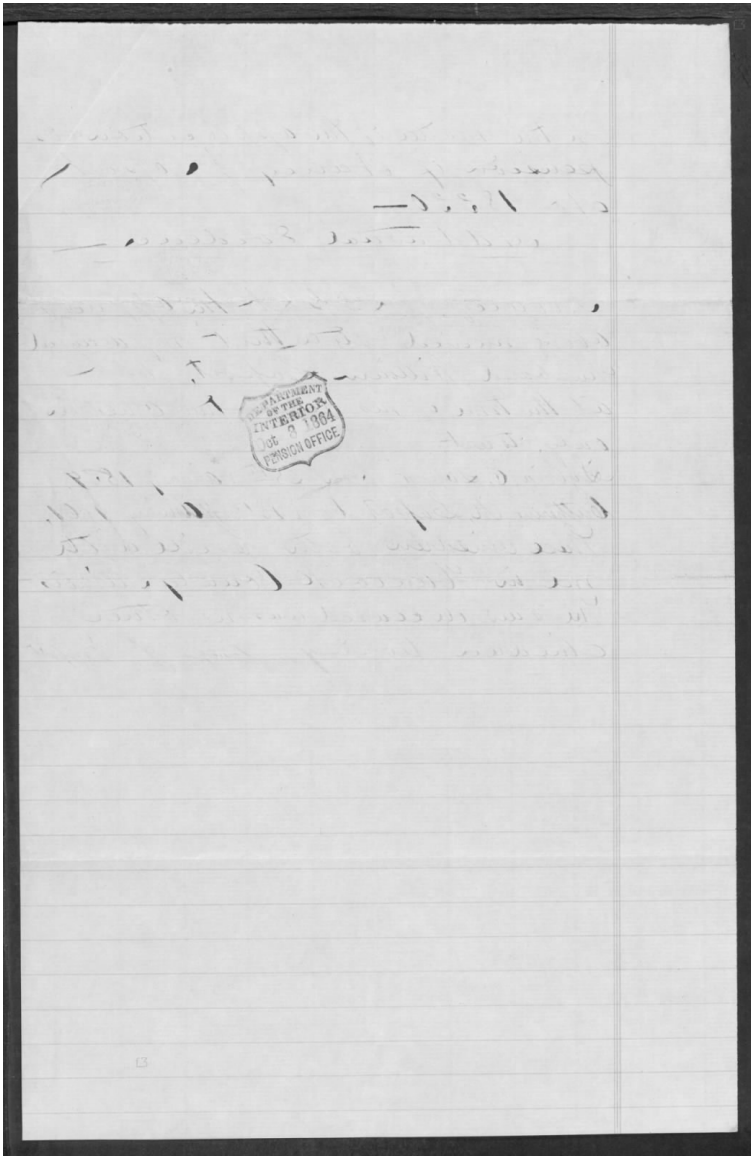


