Parsley. On Seid certificate the date of marriage of veteran and wife is carried as well as the date of birth of the respective children.

I wish to be advised whether or not this allowance was granted and paid to said widow while these children were under sixteen years of age. If so please advise me relative thereto, if not please furnish me with such blanks as required and instructions as to the method to proceed in making claim for this allowance by the children now living.
