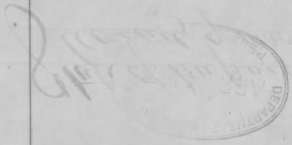

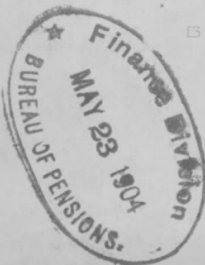

I hereby certify, That I have carefully examined George W. Scott, late a Blacksmith in Company D 7th Regt. Missouri Cavalry in the service of the United States, who was discharged at Saint Louis Mo., on the 15th day of September, 1867, and is an applicant for an invalid pension, by reason of alleged disability resulting from Injury and disease

In my opinion the said George W. Scott is totally incapacitated for obtaining his subsistence by manual labor from the cause above stated.

Judging from his present condition, and from the evidence before me, it is my belief that the said disability was received in the service aforesaid in the line of duty.

The disability is permanent.

A more particular description of the applicant's condition is subjoined: he is apparently suffering from the effects of concussion of the spine; there is a slight curvature of the spine to the left in the dorsal regions but no tenderness along the course of the spine. There is a disposition to drag the left foot as if there were some slight loss of power in the leg. There is no swelling in either the clavicles. The respiratory murmur is clear throughout, the chest and this note yielded by percussion is even, when clean and resonant. There is apparently some considerable emaciation.

Officer's Certificate to Disability of Soldier.

I Francis M Saunders do hereby certify that I was 1st Lieutenant of Company C of the 7th Regiment of Missouri Volunteers, and am acquainted with George W. Scott who was a member of my Company, and as I am informed is an applicant for an Invalid Pension. That the said George W. Scott was mustered into service on or about the 28th day of July 1861, and was discharged ~~from~~ disability about the 15th day of September 1864, having become disabled from doing duty as a soldier from on or about the 3rd day of January 1864 while in the service of the United States and in the line of his duty as a soldier, in the manner and at the place as follows:

At Little Rock Ark, on the 3rd day and year last above written he was thrown from his horse, the horse striking him in his left side causing concussion of the spine and permanent injury of his left lung, since which time he has suffered with frequent hemorrhage of the lungs, both while in the service and since his discharge, and I further certify that said fall was occasioned by no fault or negligence on the part of the said Scott, and that he was wholly blameless therein.

Scott who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is aged thirty four years, and is a resident of Warren in the State of Missouri and that he is the identical George W. Scott who was a Private in Company _____ commanded by Captain Charles R. Lambert in the 7th Regiment of Missouri Volunteers, commanded by Colonel David Hunter, in the war of 1861 and 1862, for the suppression of the rebellion in certain States of the Union, and for the maintenance of the Federal Government, and that he has not, in any way been engaged in, or aided or abetted the existing rebellion in the United States. That he volunteered as above stated, at Capitol Hill, near St. Louis in the State of Missouri, on or about the twentieth day of July, 1862, for the term of three years, and was honorably discharged at St. Louis, Mo on the fourth day of September, 1864, as will appear by his certificate of discharge, herewith presented.

That while in said service and in the line of his duty at Little Rock in the State of Arkansas on the third day of January, 1864,

he was injured by a horse which threw him to the ground striking him on the left side with his feet, the result of which was laceration of the spine and permanent injury of the left lung, since which time he has suffered frequent hemorrhages from his lungs, with the usual increase of the nervous system resulting from injury of the spine.

That since leaving said service this applicant has resided at Warren and his P. O. address is Warren County of Hancock, State of Missouri, and his occupation has been Warren.

He makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the Invalid Pension Roll of the United States, by reason of the disability above stated; and hereby constitutes and appoints Mitchell & Butz of Quincy Ills. his Attorneys to prosecute this claim, and procure a Pension Certificate. George W. Scott

Sworn to, subscribed and acknowledged before me, the day and year, first above named, and on the same day personally appeared Delilah Stearns and Sidney D. Scott residents of Hancock County in the State of Missouri and made oath that they are personally acquainted with George W. Scott who has made and subscribed the foregoing declaration in their presence, and that they have every reason to believe from the appearance of the applicant, and their acquaintance with him, that he is the identical person he represents himself to be, that they reside as above stated, and are disinterested in this claim for a Pension.

That since leaving the service of the United States as aforesaid, his habits have been uniformly good, and his occupation has been Warren and all his averments are true according to their best knowledge and belief.
