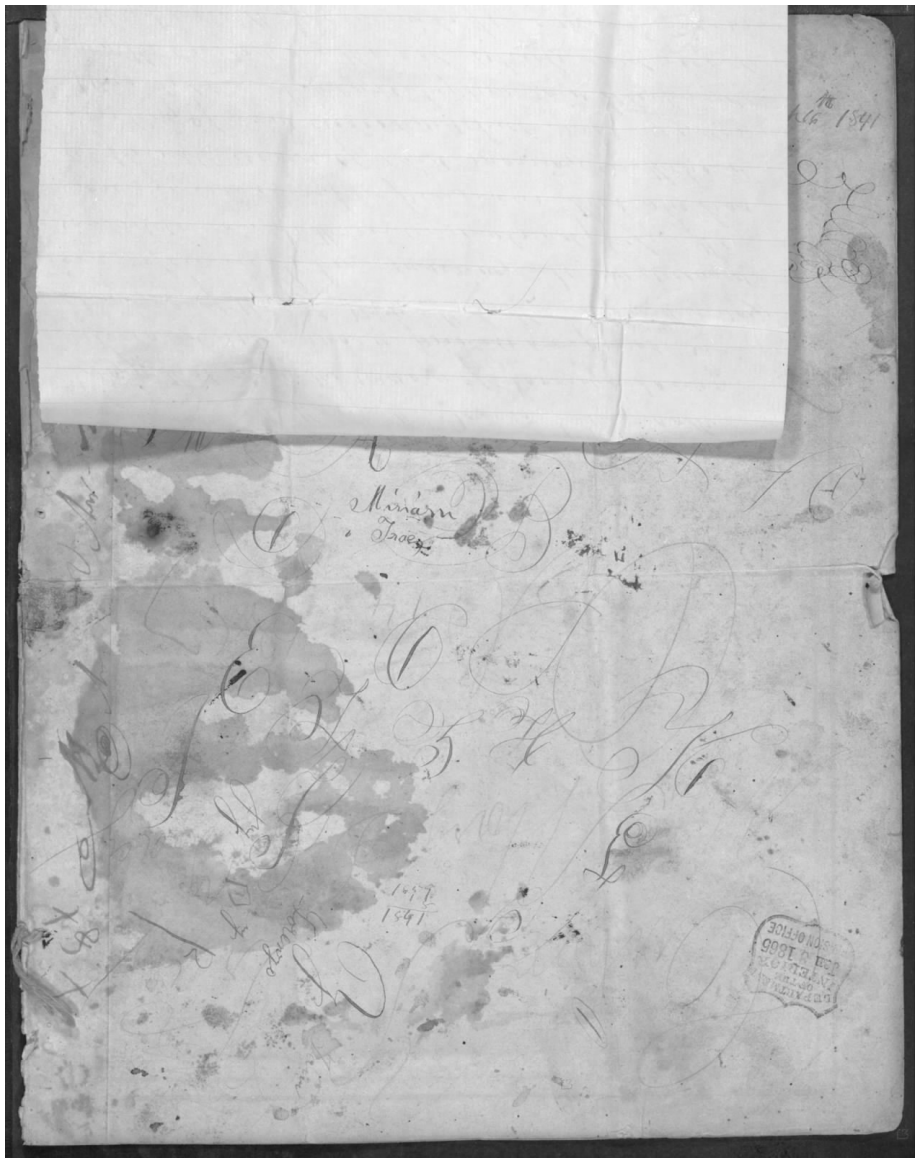

That her said husband died at Lexington in the State of Missouri, on the fourth day of September, A. D. 1862.

*She further says she has not seen any record of my said marriage and that the same took place at a time when she was residing in a neighboring county, and since she has left the county and failed to get a copy of the certificate with the proper County Clerk, she has present no other evidence in her possession of the fact of her marriage, the truth of which is stated by the oath of the declarant.*

Sarsal* lived and cohabited together as man and wife, up to the time when he entered the service, and that they were generally recognized as such by their acquaintances and neighbors, and their marriage was never questioned.

That since the death of her said husband, the said *Mary C. Sarsal* has not married, but is still a widow; and that she is the identical person she represents herself to be. All the foregoing statements they make from their own personal knowledge; and they have no interest in the prosecution of this claim.
