BIG CROWD AT LONE JACK PICNIC

The Non-Arrival of the Roney Monument Made a Dedication Impossible.

Five thousand persons—politicians out to “build fences,” veterans of the Civil War, small boys and home folks, taking advantage of a holiday—met today at Shawhan Grove, one mile east of Lone Jack, where the picnic commemorating the battle of that name, fought fifty years ago today, is being held.

There were the usual races and games and the merry-go-round and one of the famous Lone Jack picnic dinners. The unveiling and dedicating of the Roney monument, an important feature of the program, had to be dispensed with because the stone did not arrive in time.
