THE RECENT BATTLE AT LONE JACK.

KANSAS CITY, Wednesday, Aug. 20.

The Federal loss at the engagement at Lone Jack, on Friday last, is understood to have been one hundred and fifty killed, wounded and missing. The balance of the force escaped to Lexington. The section of artillery lost in the fight was taken and retaken four times, and was finally spiked and abandoned by the Nationals.

In the fight at Independence, on the 11th, Gen. Hughes, who commanded a rebel regiment at Carthage and a brigade at Wilson's Creek, was killed, and the notorious and brutal Col. Boyn and Col. Thourson were wounded, the former fatally.
