

Pro-Slavery Emigration to Kansas.

Pursuant to a notice, a meeting of the citizens of Jackson County was held at the Court House, in Independence, Mo., on Monday, the 4th of February, to take preparatory steps for forming an organization to aid and assist such persons from this county as desire to remove to Kansas, who are friendly to making the same a Slave State, when the following proceedings were had :

On motion of Col. S. H. WOODSON, Col. JAMES CHILES was called to the chair, and N. R. McMURRY appointed Secretary.

By request of the Chairman, Col. WOODSON explained the objects of the meeting; after which, on motion of Capt. REID, the following resolutions were adopted :

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this meeting that the policy and interests of Missouri require that societies shall be formed in all the counties of this State, for the purpose of aiding and assisting pioneers from Missouri friendly to the establishment and protection of Slavery in Kansas Territory.

Resolved, That they are of opinion that the time has come when the persistent efforts of fanatics in the North to abolitionize the Territory, justify and demand such organizations for our own protection, and that we call upon all the counties of Missouri to come forward and second the only wise effort to accomplish this end which has yet been put on foot.

Resolved, That the Chairman of this meeting appoint a Committee of five to draft and prepare a plan for such an organization for the County of Jackson, and report the same to an adjourned meeting for further action.

Whereupon, the Chairman appointed, as the Committee, Col. Samuel H. Woodson, Capt. J. W. Reid, A. G. Garrison, Jacob Stonestreet and James B. Davenport.

The meeting was addressed by Col. McCARTY, ALEXANDER COLLINS, Col. WOODSON, Capt. REID and others.

On motion, the meeting adjourned until the third Monday in February.

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
